Crosswalk Safety

- 1) Andrea wants to hold a bike week and encourage students to ride their bikes to school. Kari suggested that we have another one in the spring to get parents to stop driving.

- 2) Parents are very concerned about the incident where a former Timpanogos student was hit by a car on 5th North and killed. Apparently UDOT is not cooperating or being transparent with their plans to improve the situation. Many of the parents from Timpanogos live on the west side of the school so it is difficult to get parents involved with the movement to make the crosswalks safe for students. Andrea was asked by the parents to share this information so they can discuss these issues. Many parents are very concerned that they are planning to take out the tunnel. Some kind of a memorial is being planned for Caleb Lane in the near future. Andrea is concerned about where the crossing - guard parks after school. It was suggested that she park on 600 w. for safety. If things don't improve, Andrea will call the Provo Police Department. Carrie is well aware of the dangerous situation. Carrie will talk to her again.
- 3) PTA will start encouraging students to ride their bikes to school for a weekly drawing. This will hopefully eliminate all the traffic before and after school. They will also encourage people to car pool. Carrie just wants people to slow down, be careful, follow the arrows, etc...Parents want a lot more awareness brought to crosswalks.
